GRAND OPENING OF HAIR TIZ

Can a little farm girl from Kansas find happiness amongst the glitter and clatter of the big city? The answer is obviously yes. Take Polly Stadelan of Hair Tiz as a case in point. Polly, co-owner of Hair Tiz with Dave Pepin, has put in her time serving the public for many years. It goes back farther than she cares to remember when she was associated with the Arizona Inn of Tucson and the Brockway Inn of Lake Tahoe. She met her husband at the old La Jolla bar during a New Years celebration and they were married for over 34 years. They owned the Silver Room for several years. Polly was a waitress at the El Corral steak house for over ten years and she worked at the Greyhound Dog tracks for 15 years. After the death of her husband, and a period of depression, Polly got an offer to work as barmaid at The Congress and was there for 18 months when she teamed up with Dave to open what is now known as Hair Tiz.

Hair Tiz is located in one of the historical hotels in Tucson. The building was built in 1909 as the Heidel Hotel and during WW1, the name was changed to McArthur Hotel. The colorful career of this bar room has known many other names, among

them; The Bamboo Room, Iron Horse and most recently, Tucson Gays and the multitude of visitors will remember it as The Black Door when Lee and John Gartley opened it in the early 1950's and closed as the Black Door in early 1976. Hair Tiz actually opened it's doors on September 1st, 1976 but have waited for their grand opening until the arrival of their license.

Dave Pepin was born in East Liverpool Ohio and was living in Florida before coming to Tucson 6 years ago. This is his first time in the bar biz, but his knowledge of the business and his hospitality is well known to all. The only other employee at the moment is Norman Bloss who somehow finds time off from his GCS programs to work Saturday nights and all day Sunday. Norm grew up in Mexico, N.Y. and came to Arizona in 1972 after some time at Ohio State University.

This Saturday, January 22nd they will be celebrating their grand opening. Cocktail hour will run from 4 to 8. Tickets will be given with each drink and drawings for door prizes will begin at 10 pm and the grand prize drawing at midnight. You must be present to win. And don't forget



EDITORIAL

Our civil liberties are in danger! Anyone concerned about their freedom to exercise sexual preference in private, among consenting adults should take warning. Our Arizona Legislature is now in session. They will have presented before them, a complete revision of the Arizona Criminal Code. While some sections of these new revisions are an improvement, there are several sections that are definitely a step backward. There are four sections that affect homosexuals in particular, and they are Chapter 14 "Sexual Offenses"; Chapter 32 "Prostitution"; Chapter 35 "Obscenity" and Chapter 29 "Offenses Against Public Order". We will not go into any great detail on these specific chapters, but would urge you to contact GCS for an excellent brochure that gives exact wording of these chapters, and judge for yourselves why we are so concerned about what the Legislature is doing with our freedom. There is a quote from Abraham Lincoln that goes, "Those who deny freedom to others, deserve it not for themselves and under a just God, cannot long retain it".

We cannot allow our elected officials to be blind to the fact that we are all created equal, and we will not be intimidated to believe otherwise. Another quote, this time from Norman Corwin is applicable: "Freedom isn't something to be won and then forgotten. It must be renewed like soil after yielding good crops. It must be rewound like a faithful clock, exercised like a healthy muscle. Free men who forget that, lose their freedom".

Your civil liberties are in jeopardy. We are not criminals and we must not allow ourselves to be branded thusly. You can call your Senator and Congressman by dialing their toll free number in Phoenix 1-800-252-4001. Write your representatives State Capitol Building, Phoenix, Arizona, 85007. Here is a list of your Tucson representatives by district. The rest is up to you. Be concerned.



In the next few days arrangements with the Sheriff's Department will be completed to allow members of our group to have special visiting privileges at the jail. We are prepared to assist with securing release or obtaining legal assistance and are willing to appear in court when necessary.
