EDITORIAL RECALL BIRDSALL

In the past, we have voiced our opinion on the outrageous decision made by Pima County Superior Judge Ben C. Birdsall in the Richard Heekin murder fiasco, and this will be the last of our editorializing on this man. We have expressed our concern by contacting all of the national press as well as the local media. We have received nothing but good response from our efforts, and yet Judge Birdsall still sits in judgment in a trial that is giving him national publicity and prominence. We contend that this is wrong.

Several minority groups have expressed their dissatisfaction with other rulings made by this man. Our Newsletter is only a voice. People have to take the action. There are several Gay organizations in town, each with their own service to offer.

We are supposed to have an active political arm, The Tucson Gay Coalition. If, in fact, they are active and concerned with the Tucson Gay Community, we believe they are missing the chance of a lifetime.

The State of Arizona is unique in that we have the power to recall any member of our Judiciary. We fully realize that a recall is an enormous undertaking, but taking the recent recall of some members of our City Council, we also realize that recall does work. With the national press in town for the Adamson trial, the time to strike is now. We call on the Tucson Gay Coalition to show what it can do. If necessary, join with other members of Minority groups and petition for the recall of Judge Ben C. Birdsall. It can be done. It should be done.

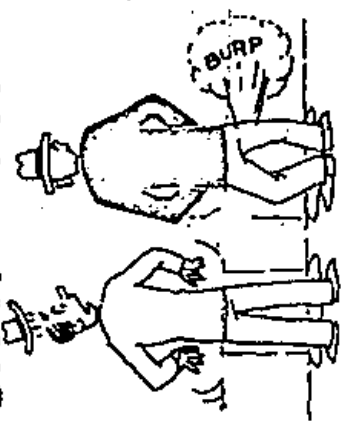

Alcohol or alcoholism is not a respecter of persons. Alcoholism is a disease and becomes progressively worse as an individual continues to drink habitually. Everyone is different; therefore there are some people who can drink sensibly. Few problems have been so baffling as in the nature of alcoholism. It has only been in recent years that there has been as much attention and research being done in regard to the disease of alcohol, but little has been known about either the cause or cure of alcoholism. When a person drinks habitually over a period of time, the disease begins taking its toll in many ways. People find it more difficult to refuse a drink when offered, or by taking too many drinks when alone or in the company of others. Usually with the refusal to quit drinking in excess, the toll begins to show its ugly baffling head in other ways such as affecting a persons relationship with others. He or she then starts to feel the effect in their finances, calling in to work Mondays due to illness, in reality a hangover. Excessive drinking affects an individuals health, nervous system and other parts of the anatomy. In summation, an alcoholic is anyone whose drinking interferes frequently or continuously with any of his or her important life adjustments and interpersonal relationships. Many problem drinkers think they drink because they have unmanageable problems, generally however, they have unmanageable problems because they drink. NGTF

We have just received confirmation that the National Gay Task Force is preparing a ten week advertising campaign in the Tucson Gay Newsletter. The force behind this campaign is NGTF member Richard Mackey of Los Angeles. This is being done as a memorial to Fred Fontain, Mackey's lover who was slain in California and to Richard Heakin who, we all know, was slain here in Tucson. To quote Mr. Mackey's letter in part, "...a true memorial to those past will be a greater awareness by those present that it is their actions (however small) which will affect the promise of the future. Indeed it is time." We are, of course in perfect agreement with Mr. Mackey's premise, and whole heartedly support his action.

For those of you not familiar with NGTF, it was created in 1973. They presently have over 2500 members. NGTF was formed to link the countrys 1100 Gay and Lesbian groups by acting as a communications network through national projects in the media and through legislation. Their desire was to make NGTF a genuinely Grass roots movement which would include people from all sorts of backgrounds and walks of life. They are very active in reform of laws that adversely affect the Homosexual lifestyle, rules and policies that prevent Homosexuals from employment or religion, and protesting the medias when their coverage portrays Homosexuals in a poor or stereotyped picture.

As one small example, NGTF launched the protest across the country when the producers of the Marcus Welby show were going to put "The Outrage" on ABC for the second time. As a result of the nationwide Gay protest, eleven national sponsors cancelled the program, ABC had to drop its advertising rates before it could sell the open air time, seven stations in various major cities refused to carry the show, and local stations freely gave time to groups to refute the programs image of a male teacher's being a Homosexual child molester.

Their fight for fair employment practices won favorable responses from AT&T, the nations largest corporate employer, the Bank of America, the world's largest bank, IBM, ABC, CBS, NBC, American Airlines, Eastern Airlines, Avon, Citicorp, Honeywell, Proctor & Gamble, McDonald's and McGraw-Hill. A letter from the Chairman of the Board of AT&T sums up this fight for equality, "An individual's sexual preferences are not criteria either for becoming an employee or remaining an employee of the Bell system. Job retention and promotability are based upon demonstrable job performance and behavior. An individual's sexual tendencies or preferences are strictly personal and information about these matters should not be sought out by company personnel."

To quote Bruce Voeller, Executive Director of NGTF, "Our fight is to make the world see us as being as diverse and varied as everyone else. It can only be won by fostering a climate where bankers, lawyers and athletes feel it is safe to come out. We can't shove them out, but we can make it more attractive to be out."

GCS

HAVE FINISHED IT?

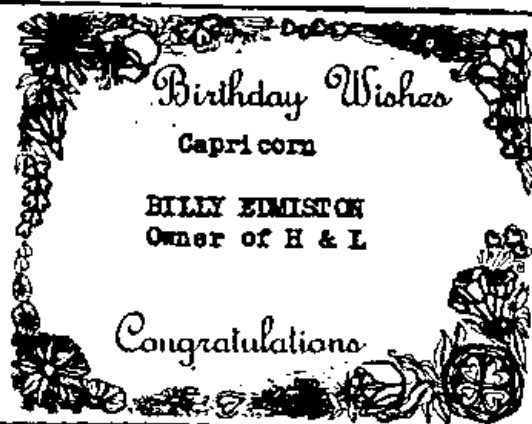
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Can stop the love I have inside?
