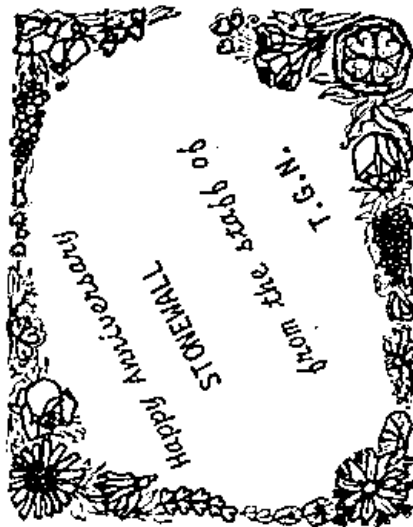

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Gay relationships tend to be shorter-lived than straight relationships. Long term Gay partnerships are the exception. Why?

Our social scientists tell us that the Gay community lacks the social institutions that bring stability to the Straight community. The Gay community generally does not have a widely accepted church, school, business associations, etc.

This lack of social institutions is being changed. One change is the Metropolitan Community Church which has established itself nation-wide. Nation-wide or not, this church often struggles for existence within the individual community. Gay support for the Metropolitan Community Church is a Gay effort to bring itself spiritual support, and one of the most effective possible efforts to inject stability into the Gay community.

Your support for the M.C.C. is your support for yourself. Do I mean that you should only send the Church a check? No, I mean that you should also bring yourself to the next meeting this Sunday at 6:30 PM at 920 N. 1st Ave.

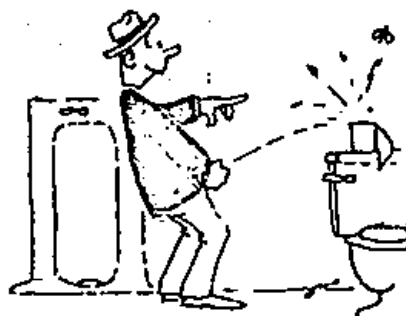
