

## Halloween Comes To Arizona

### Phoenix

PHOENIX - Halloween is here again and some fantastic plans are being made to make this entire weekend one of the busiest Phoenix has ever seen. Festivities actually began last Wednesday at Miss Matty's Attic where their Halloween party was a big success and that should be an indication of what is to come over the weekend. Gayla Ball, parties and more parties are planned with literally hundreds of dollars to be awarded for best costumes. The weekend in Phoenix begins at the Unlimited on Saturday the 29th with a big "Costume Party" beginning at 8:00 p.m. The winner of the costume contest will receive \$25.00, runner-up gets \$15.00 and third place will get a \$5.00 prize.

On Sunday, the "7th Annual Halloween Gayla Ball" takes place in the Grand Ballroom of the Adams Hotel at the corner of Central Avenue and Adams in Phoenix. Mickey Turner and Jo Anne will act as Host and Hostess for this huge affair. The show will feature Carmen del Rio. The biggest of all the contests takes place here with the persons lucky enough to win the titles of "King" or "Queen" of the Ball receiving, for their efforts, \$250.00 each. In addition the most "original costume" will be the recipient of a \$100.00 prize. This ball, now in its seventh year, is by far the most prestigious and hundreds of persons will be in attendance. Tickets are \$8.00 and are now available at the Forum-Boardwalk and will also be sold at the door which opens at 6:00 p.m. on Saturday. Also on Monday evening Mr. Fat Fingers will hold their "Halloween Masquerade Party" with prizes of \$50, \$25 and \$15 for first, second and third place in their costume contest. Over at Casa de Roma, their "Wild Halloween Party" goes from 9:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. Monday night with prizes for the King, Queen and Best Costume.

That makes about \$1,000 in prize money being offered to anyone for just going out and having a good time in Phoenix. A truly big weekend, something going on every night, and we wish everyone a Gayla time in the Capitol City.

Rev. Perry has appeared on every major television talk show in the United States. Recently he has been involved in the White House Conference on Gay Rights. Most of all, Troy Perry is a loving, caring friend.

Ordination of Gays, or "avowed and practicing homosexuals" as some church people would say, has come to the forefront in the past two years, especially in the Episcopal Church. During the past two weeks, the Episcopal House of Bishops decided to continue ordaining "homosexuals" seeing it as an error to deny ordination to those created this way. It is a difficult paradox when many churches are on record as decrying job discrimination against Gays in the secular world and yet discriminating quite blatantly within their own walls. A study by the Institute for Sex Research in 1970 showed that 77% of the people polled would not allow a male homosexual to be a minister. So even if one sought ordination, would one be allowed to "practice?" And yet all this has not dismayed some. Only two self-proclaimed Gays have been ordained in the main-line Christian churches in recent times; what has gone on before is unknown.

The first openly Gay ordained is William Johnson, ordained in 1973 by the United Church of Christ. The second is Ellen Barrett, first ordained a deacon in 1975 and then a priest in January of this year. The ordination of Gays controversy has centered around Rev. Barrett. Not just Anglicans have offered dismay, rage and disgust. To add to this difficulty, a few other clergy have openly proclaimed and celebrated their Gayness after they had been ordained; there has usually elapsed a period of several years between the two events. The most notable clergy in this category has been Malcolm Boyd, an Episcopal priest, perhaps best known for his civil rights work and books that "offended" the "establishment." At least he did address some of the concerns of Gay people before it radical chic in his book, Are You Running With Me Jesus?

# MCC Church - Phoenix Victim of Arson

PHOENIX - The Casa de Cristo Metropolitan Community Church of Phoenix suffered a very devastating fire last Sunday, Oct. 23: Just after everyone left the Congregational Meeting and just before the Sunday evening services, at approximately 6:15 in the evening, fire broke out in the kitchen facilities of the church, completely destroying the kitchen and social hall and inflicting severe damage to the rest of the structure. Fire officials definitely suspect arson as the cause, pointing out that flammable liquid was poured in the kitchen area and ignited. The kitchen door was found open by the firemen reinforcing their opinion of arson.

Damage to the structure and contents amounts to about \$20,000. Although some insurance will be forthcoming it would not be nearly sufficient to reproduce the building or purchase another. The church has been subject to vandalism in the past with thefts of the church organ and all of its chairs as well as the usual harassment of broken windows and obscene phone calls from time to time.

Rev. Fred Pattison could not be reached at press time but in a telephone report to AGN late Monday, Joe Sombrio, Pattison's lover, reported that the church had just been completely remodeled in a Spanish motif, with the help of many of the congregation, and there was to have been a re-dedication ceremony on Sunday, November 6 coinciding with the visit of Rev. Troy Perry and the District Conference being held on that weekend. The name "Casa de Cristo" had just been chosen and was to be added to the name of the church at the re-dedication ceremonies.

Sunday, Oct. 30, the 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. services will be held on the lawn adjacent to the burned out church. Plans for weekday services and the location of the following Sunday services remain unknown at press time. The telephone has been hooked back up and a temporary office has been set up. For further information you may call the church and watch for announcements in next weeks issue of AGN. Sombrio stated that the Casa de Cristo MCC/Phoenix Church will remain the host church for the District Conference and location of meeting places for the conference will be announced as soon as suitable places can be found. Your donations and prayers are asked for this beleaguered congregation.

Table decorations, and wines, for which the countries are best known, contribute much to everyone's enjoyment, as does a background music selection to fit the occasion.

Dishes that can be prepared in advance have been planned into each menu. With an organized plan of action, based on most of the cooking being done ahead of time, the host can relax and enjoy a culinary trip around the world in one meal, along with the guests. A small, intimate party of four is highly recommended.

This weeks salad from Puerto Rico you will find very simple to prepare and a truly delightful salad with any meal.

MENU #1 ORANGE STUFFED AVACADO SALADS PUERTO RICO

2 large ripe avacados, chilled	1 tsp. sugar
2 oranges, chilled	salt and pepper to taste
2 tbs. olive oil	4 large lettuce leaves
1 tsp. wine vinegar	1 tsp. lemon juice
	sprigs of mint

Cut avacados in half lengthwise. Remove pits. Scoop out pulp and cut into small cubes. Save the shells. Peel the oranges. Cut into sections. Toss orange sections and avacado cubes together lightly. Combine olive oil, vinegar, lemon juice, sugar, salt and pepper. Pour over fruit and mix gently. Fill avocado shells with mixture. Garnish with sprigs of mint. Put lettuce on individual plates. Serve salads on lettuce leaves.

 2 eggs  
 1 tsp. baking soda  
 1/4 tsp. salt  
 1/2 tsp. ginger  
 1/4 tsp. nutmeg  
 3 very ripe bananas crushed.

Cream butter, sugar and eggs together. Add sifted dry ingredients. Mix well and add bananas. Pour into loaf pan, then sprinkle combined white sugar and cinnamon over the top. Bake 40 to 50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Really a great recipe. Thanks Todd.






