Otis an 18 year old brown hair, green eyed young man and Cindy is a 17 year old blonde beauty of a Gay young woman.

TUCSON - Two of Tucson's watering holes are celebrating their first anniversary beginning this week. Ironically, both are at either end of the bar spectrum. The town's largest disco-restaurant, Jekyll's and Hyde's and the neighborhood conversation bar, Hair Tiz. Jekyll's is celebrating their anniversary in fine style with champagne, shows, buffet, special drink prices along with big door prizes. Hair Tiz has a celebration that will last five days and includes their famous huge buffet this Saturday, plus a show Friday evening and many other special events.

Jekyll's, in conjunction with the Last Culture, has recently undergone extensive remodeling to their premises, making it one of the hottest disco-showbar-restaurant complexes in the Southwest. Owners Bernie Busfield, Joel Maisano and Budd Sherrick have done everything in their power to make their establishment a definite must for everyone in the community. Their extensive menu for lunch and dinner have made it one of the more popular eating places around. The recent advent of their shows "in the round" have excited audiences each Sunday and Thursday night, and their disk jockeys Rick Norman and Ronnie Rios and on occasion Odis have proven themselves to be the hottest music makers in the state.

One of Tucson's more popular "friendly neighborhood bars, The Hair Tiz, was opened on the same Labor Day weekend last year. Owners Polly Stadelman and Dave Pepin have worked hard to remodel and create the friendly atmosphere that pervades this unique establishment. Lawsuit against Houston police is for \$3.5 million

HOUSTON - Levi's (a Houston Gay Bar) and one of it's customers have filed a \$3.5 million law suit against eleven Houston police officers and the city of Houston, alleging they were the victims of police brutality which led to the closing of the club. The suit was filed August 9 in U.S. District Court. It claims vice officers came to the bar June 22 and "without provocation" began beating manager Bob Jones and bartender Neil Mann. A customer, Pat McDonald, also became involved and unjustly treated.

The suit also alleges the police forced the plaintiffs to "pose for humiliating and degrading photographs." The suit goes on to claim that one police officer threatened Jones' life two days after the bar incident and a short time after that, \$2,100 was found missing in Jones' apartment after the same officers had entered it. The suit also states that the club had complained to the internal affairs division of the Houston Police Department but they received no concrete results. And in fact, information that was supposed to be confidential between Levi's and the Internal Affairs division was leaked to the police officers involved, the suit stated.

The head of the vice division of the Houston police has denied the allegations of harrasment and threats

News Briefs

WASHINGTON - As a follow up to our front page story in last weeks issue of AGN here is how your congressmen in Arizona voted for the Legal Aid Assistance. Mo Udall was the lone congressman who voted against the passage and should be commended for standing with us and attempting to uphold our rights. Rep Rudd a Republican and Rep. Stump a Democrat voted for the legislation which prohibits public funds from being used to defend Gay rights in discrimination cases. Rep John Rhodes did not vote.

NEW YORK - An article in a recent issue of the Journal of Clinical Psychology suggests, according to Harvard researchers, that sex offenders can sometimes be detected by a simple test. Men convicted of rape, child molestation, and incest can frequently be differentiated from others by how they draw the human anatomy.

Sex offenders, the article claims, tend to put large heads and pointed noses on their drawings, also to draw men and women with exaggerated genitals. The Harvard researchers say the test is good enough for police to use.

OTTAWA, CA. - If you are boycotting orange juice, you should be interested to learn that new scientific findings show grape juice has a specific anti-virus activity - meaning grape juice may be a lot better than orange juice in preventing colds and other infections. This means the Gay community could lead the nation in a Switch to Grape, for a healthier country in more ways than one. SAN FRANCISCO SENTINEL

SAN FRANCISCO - In the wake of the continuing story of anti-Gay violence in the Bay area, 30 year old Charles Lewis was kidnapped by five teenagers and was raped by two at gunpoint. While the two females in the group held a gun in his mouth, two of the three males raped him shouting, "Anita is right." Following the multiple anal assaults the girls moved the gun from Lewis's mouth and the same two males attempted forcible oral entry. The details of the bizarre events were reported to police by the victim following his remarkable escape by jumping out of his abductors car as they supposedly were taking him "someplace to kill him." CHICAGO - The National Gay Task Force announced plans to open an office in Chicago in October, according to Jean O'Leary, national co-executive director. Ms. O'Leary was in Chicago several weeks ago to meet with community leaders in preparation for the opening of the office, a pilot program which hopefully will lead to offices in every state. The branch office will be staffed by 2 co-field directors, a man and a woman, as well as an executive secretary. GAY LIFE

MINNEAPOLIS, MN. - The Twin City Gays have taken advertisements in Miami Newspapers urging Dade County Gays to come to their cities. The ads invite Gay refugees to move to the Twin Cities, where city ordinances protect the rights of Gays. The Target City Coalition, which opposes singer Anita Bryant's campaign against homosexuals, sponsored the ad. Bryant has listed Minneapolis among several target cities where she plans to continue her fight. DATA BOY

Responding to what he termed a "heavy question," Lucy said, "I would hate to say anything derogatory about anything as wholesome as Anita Bryant and Florida orange juice. But I really was not awfully pleased with her efforts in that regard. Hostility and hatred: A sign of the times?

Grumbling, Nagging, Distrustful, No Respect, the list goes on and on. Our Gay communities are seemingly showing all of these unhappy traits. Bar owners are ripping off patrons - patrons are ripping off bar owners, patrons are ripping off patrons and bar owners are ripping off bar owners. This person is sexist. That person discriminates. The other is a crook. She is a dyke. He is a drag queen.

In an attempt to figure out what is happening, we will do an in-depth series on togetherness, unity, love and peace, or whatever you might want to title it. If there ever was a time that the entire Gay community - Gay men and Lesbian women needed to close ranks, it is NOW. Many of our Gay businesses are floundering from lack of support from the Gay community. In this first of a series, we present an editorial that appeared in the Arizona Daily Star, written by staff writer Ken Burton. It may have been written for the straight community, but it appears to this writer to have been aimed directly at our Gay communities.

"There seems to be something in the air these days that is worse and thicker than the humidity. It is hostility.

There was a big dose of hostility over in Clifton where the police force walked off the job, and then came back, while the Town Council was threatening to resign, and then not to resign, and then again, to resign. Some folks in Clifton decided to help the council members make up their minds, and began talking about a recall.

Down in Douglas, recall rumblings came on the heels of hostility that surfaced when some wanted to rename a park after hometown-boy-made-good, Raul Castro. Hostility came to Bisbee, also in the form of a recall. Mayor Lew Murphy and the City Council of Tucson talked of doing away with the council's regular "call to the audience" Why? Many speakers lined up not to criticize policy or program, but to vent their spleen. With hostility.

The board of Tucson Unified School District 1 said they had encountered the same thing and they wondered aloud about banning their own calls to the audience. Enough hostility is enough. When Rep. Morris K. Udall introduced a mining bill, he and Vice President Walter Mondale were met at a Tucson fundraiser by pickets. Among other things, one sign called Udall a traitor. That could hardly be classed as honest disagreement. It was hostility.

And talk to nearly anyone these days about government or its institutions. The social Security Administration is full of crooks. The Veterans Administration is inept. The Internal Revenue Service is inherently evil. FBI agents are all burglars. The military is full of trigger-happy killers who pick their teeth with A-Bomb fuses. Congress doesn't give a damn. Hostile conversations.

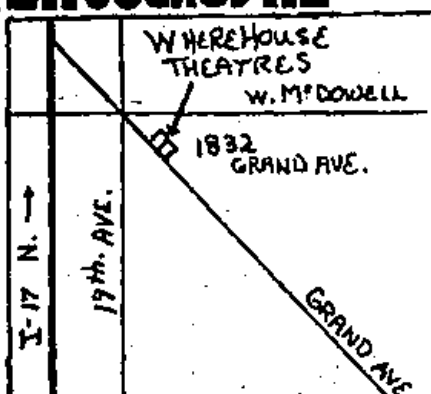

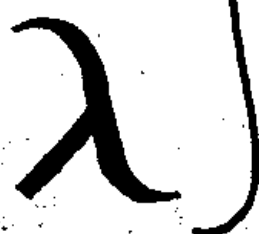

Interview with EMPERESS NICOLE

This is the second and final part of our exclusive interview with Nicole, Dowager Empress de San Diego and Chairperson of the Imperial Council of Courts. In this part Nicole looks back over the first year of the Tucson Court.

I. I understand there is a woman running for Emperor of the Tucson Court this time.

N. Yes, I talked her into it. She wasn't going to run but I told her she should. I don't know that much about her, but I think that women should really consider running, even if it is controversial, but they'll say - hey, there's a woman, and that'll give the initiative in the future for other women to run, and I'd like to see that happen in any court.

I. One of your reasons for your visit to Tucson is as an advisor to attempt to clear the air between the Tucson and Phoenix courts isn't it?

N. At the meeting last week, the people from Phoenix were very mistaken that the ICC was trying to go into it's boundaries and so forth. There is no boundary, and as for dictating and things, we don't. This is an internal problem, we are here to assist and to advise, that is all. How would we know what is best for Phoenix, Tucson or the State of Arizona when we don't reside there. At the meeting, I just asked Phoenix exactly what they felt, what their stand was. They had sent me a letter saying that they did recognize the Imperial Court of Tucson. I asked the Tucson court members, I wanted to know what their feeling was, I said do you wish to join in this corporation? They voted unanimously not to join. Jerrod was very diplomatic and very understanding. I think the meeting ended up in a very happy and productive note. Everyone decided that because of this vote it does not mean that it never will happen.

I. I know that many people in Tucson are not aware of what the court is all about.

N. I am not sure that the court of Tucson is totally aware of where it is going. They are experiencing the same problems every beginning court has. There is not one city that has not had the same situations Tucson has had. The growing pains. I have talked to members of the court and told them the biggest thing is education. You have to educate the community concerning what the court is all about. Naturally if I were sitting in a bar and know nothing about the court and someone came in in their tiara's and crowns I would say "who are these sickies?" Your paper has done a lot in this regard. Everytime I come to Tucson and pick up the paper and read something about the court, I realize that this is part of it - letting the people know.

I. You talked about monies being raised by the court. Many people are skeptical as to exactly where this money goes.

N. Everyone, everywhere always questions this. When I was Empress and threw a benefit, I always made sure that the persons who were to receive the money were responsible for getting their treasurer at the door to collect the money. Do not present the money later on. During my entire reign I never touched a penny, and I try to stress this to all the courts. But what Tucson has to realize is that a court cannot survive without money itself, and they must have fund raisers for themselves. A court has to have a treasury. But at the same time, one of the court's main things is to raise funds for social service organizations. We just raised a thousand something for Dignity in San Diego for their building fund just three weeks ago. We had already raised money for MCC's Building. Maybe our next will be for Integrity. I think it might be a good thing for Tucson to do something like this, especially since Dignity is now starting a chapter here.

I. Primarily though the Court is designed to help organizations in our Gay community isn't it?

N. It's two fold. The main function is to help the community organizations and also it is a rolling chamber of commerce, going outside their empires to build up their community and make people want to come to Tucson. Also now the court is becoming politically involved, letter writing campaigns, voter registration etc. It's political, social and fund raiser, all three.

I. I certainly understand that the first year the court would have growing pains, but the Tucson court has certainly had a most controversial first year.



N. Personally I think it is sad concerning Fernando. It is sad because he is Emperor I, he was duly elected. It looks bad. I understand that a compromise had been offered him to keep his title. I wish Fernando had accepted that. I know he has his pride and his own reasoning. It probably hurts him inside, I know it does, because it would hurt me, not being able to be recognized as Emperor I. Can you imagine that at this coronation, Fernando would be up on that throne, with the honors of an Emperor, crowning the next Emperor. I have not only read the situation and I have been advised, but I have also gone to many of his friends and asked. I do not like the method in which it was handled, but at the same time the court did not know the proper method of doing it, but I was pleased that, at least, they did offer him something and he should have accepted. I haven't talked to Fernando. I like him. He is a really nice guy. As the court of Tucson progresses and becomes productive and respected, as I am sure it will be, Fernando will regret his decision because to be Emperor I is a really true honor. Yes, it is sad about Fernando, but I am Mexican too, and I can put myself in his place - however right or wrong - I probably would have reacted the same way and I probably would have kicked ass.

I. Are all the courts bar oriented?

N. In California we have Bar Guilds or Business Guilds where courts are usually staunchly supported by businessmen. They support us because we do in fact act as a chamber of commerce.

I. The reason for that question was the close relationship between Jekyll's and the producer of the court, Budd Sherrick. This association gave people the impression that the court was owned by Jekyll's.

N. Most courts are either owned by themselves, by a producer or they are owned by a corporation or board of directors. In San Diego we have producers. San Francisco's Empress is owned by the Tavern Guild. Portland and Denver are corporations. There are different situations. In Tucson, I can understand why people feel that way but if it hadn't been for Budd there would never have been a court and obviously since he was associated with a bar, he would have been a fool not to have the first coronation at his bar. But he realized that the second coronation would have to be held at a hotel or some neutral ground. Few people know that most courts started in a bar, and most candidates were associated with that bar. By the same token the Long Beach court is very church and bar oriented.

I. Can you tell us of some of the plans for the upcoming Tucson coronation on October 2nd?

N. Well it is unfortunate that the Tucson court did not know, but Sunday is not the best day for many out of state people. It would have been much better if it were held on Saturday. Naturally a lot of business people have to be back at work on Monday morning. I don't know what effect it will have on the out of state visitors but it will have some adverse effect. But I am sure every court will be represented and the fact that this is the first ICC associated event in Arizona there will be a lot of people here. The Ramada Inn's accommodations are perfect and the ball room is very spacious. As MC's, Marcus, Emperor I of San Francisco and I will do the chores. Emperor I Marcus is a very powerful person in Northern California. I am glad he is coming because it will be very prestigious for the Tucson court. We both have the reputation of keeping the program moving. I am hoping, as I know all of Tucson is, to have all these people go back to their homes and carry the word of what a fine time they had, what a wonderful town Tucson is. I know that people like a coronation that is fun more than just the beauty and pomp of an elegant coronation. I really feel the Tucson coronation is going to be fun. I think the community of Tucson is going to be impressed. I just hope they get more educated about the court system.

A spot check of these establishments reveals that since the first of the year over \$1,000 has been received and in the last ten days, checks amounting to approximately \$200 have been returned.

Many of these current ones will be picked up after the unfortunate business man has tracked down the guilty parties. To make matters worse, it has been reported that often, when persons are called, they express indignation that they were even contacted. No one should have to be reminded that when writing a check, that is not covered by sufficient funds, it is a serious legal matter, but beyond that it is not fair to your Gay owned establishments. If anyone believes that these businesses are making a fortune and can afford to act as a bank or loan office you are mistaken. If this serious matter continues it can only result in these establishments taking legal action and discontinuing their check cashing policy, which is merely a convenience to the community and should not be taken advantage of.

HAPPINESS IS

TUCSON - Happiness is the many fine cooks in Tucson. So in the future, I'll be including the favorite recipes of some of the well-known members of the community. This week I'm featuring Potted Beef Italian Style, which is the favorite of Joel one of the owners of the Last Culture. It sounds mouth-watering and I hope you will try it.

For eight generous servings. Heat enough oil in a crockpot or skillet, to quickly brown 4 pounds of cubed bottom round beef.

- To the browned beef, add:
- 2 chopped onions
 - 1 bunch celery (chopped) incl. leaves
 - 10 chopped carrots
 - 1 doz sliced mushrooms
 - 2 bay leaves
 - salt, pepper & garlic to taste.

Brown the onions over medium heat then add:

- 2 cups red wine
- 1 six ounce can tomato paste
- 1 cup beef bouillon.

Simmer, covered, over low heat for 2 1/2 hours. Stir occasionally; add water if necessary.

Shortly before serving time, cook 1 1/2 to 2 pounds of pasta such as Large Shells or Rotini. Serve the stew over the pasta.

NOTE: The stew can be cooked the night before and reheated on party night.

SUGGESTION: Serve with a dry red wine such as Paul Masson's Rubion.
